How do I get there?

Once you've finished your GCSEs or A-Levels / BTEC, there are lots of different options for you to work or study in the green sector.



A Levels

You choose three subjects to study for two years in sixth form.



College

You can study Level 1, Level 2 and Level 3 courses at College.



Apprenticeships

These are available for people aged 16+ and involve working for an employer and studying towards a qualification at the same time.



T Levels

These are equivalent to 3 A Levels. 80% takes place in the classroom, and 20% in the workplace. They are two years long.



Straight into Work

You could get a job directly, and sometimes there is a chance to be trained up in the workplace or be put through an apprenticeship later on.

These are Level 1 courses designed to help you build your confidence, skills, and also include intensive Maths and English support.

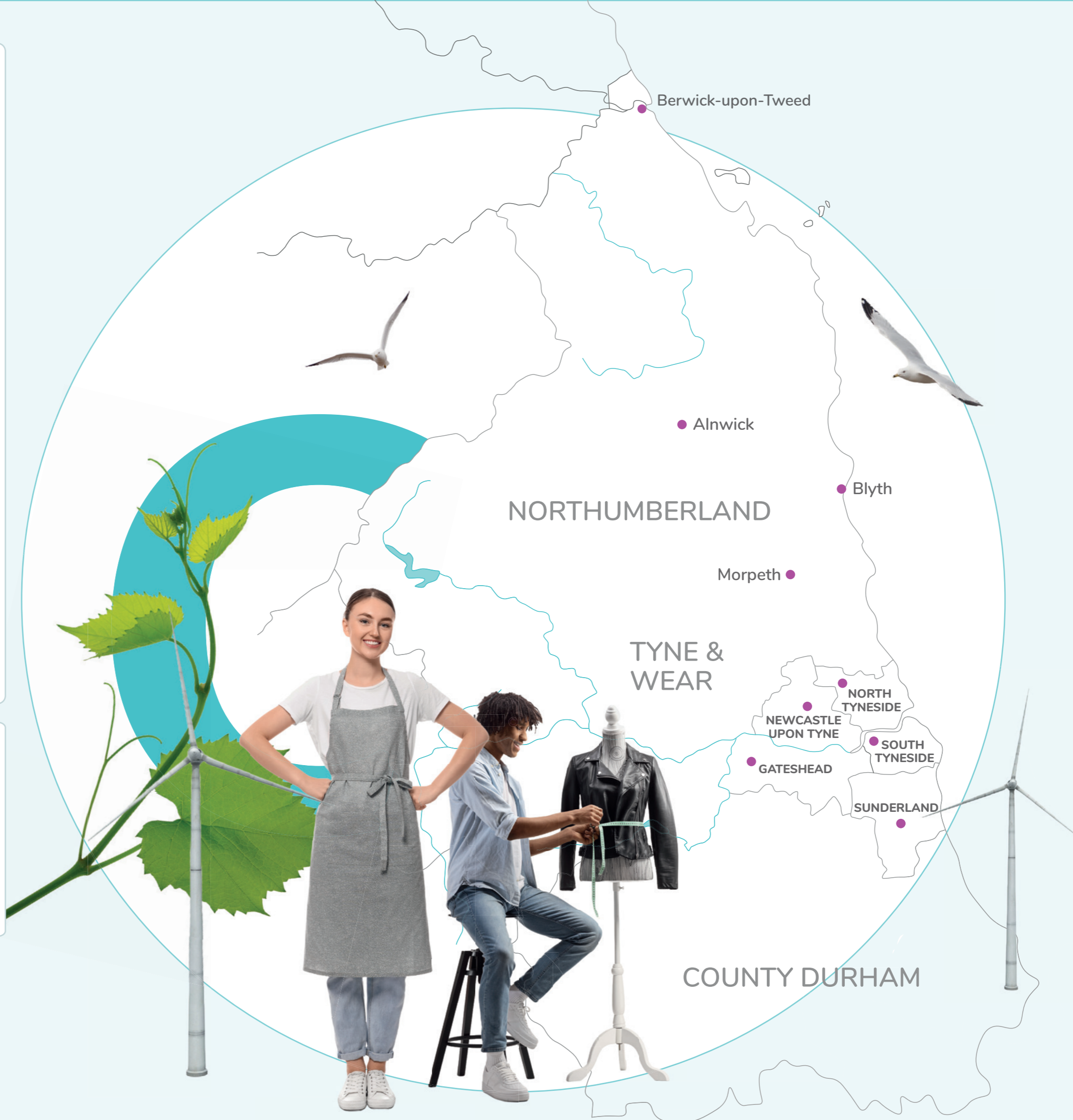
